Get Out More CIC is a social enterprise on a mission to help people engage with nature to feel better in mind and body. We run outdoor programmes, including forest schools, outdoor play and community engagement programmes for people of all ages across West Yorkshire. We use local woodlands, parks and natural spaces to bring people together, be active and feel good, working towards our vision: *communities and nature growing healthier together*.

The Forest School Play Project is a Better Start Bradford project being delivered by Get Out More. It is an exciting forest school and outdoor play programme for 3-year-old children and their parents. The Better Start Bradford programme is funded by the National Lottery Community Fund to help children in Bowling and Barkerend, Bradford Moor and Little Horton get the best start in life.

The Get Out More team have been successfully running the Forest School Play Project for 3 years. Due to the success of the programme, we are seeking an additional worker to help us expand and deliver the next phase of the programme. We are looking for a friendly, dedicated and proactive individual who enjoys working with children and can share their love of outdoor play and nature with people from a range of backgrounds. The Practitioner will run regular, accessible and engaging free forest school and outdoor play activities in parks, woodlands and outdoor spaces in the Better Start Bradford area (Bowling & Barkerend, Bradford Moor and Little Horton).

#### **Main duties**

- Take a lead in planning and developing a series of daytime, after school and weekend play sessions for children and their families in the Better Start Bradford area
- Support our Better Start Bradford Forest School Practitioner on forest school sessions in Bradford nurseries
- Develop awareness of the programmes in the Better Start Bradford area through liaising with local providers and community organisations
- Engage the local community through marketing, attending community events and other activities organised by Better Start Bradford and its projects

- Facilitate a range of games and activities ensuring sessions are engaging, age appropriate, fun and adhere to Get out More's policies and procedures
- Ensure project monitoring is completed and submitted in line with the requirements of the funder
- Attend team and line management meetings and appraisals
- Work on other Get Out More programmes as required, depending on availability

- Enjoy working with children (including very young children) from a range of backgrounds and commitment to supporting their physical, social and emotional development through a nurturing approach to outdoor play / forest school activities
- Experience of working with hard-to-reach families and developing positive relationships
- Skilled and knowledgeable in a range of age-appropriate outdoor activities including games and crafts, and able to share skills in line with good practice, policies and procedures
- A good communicator, friendly and polite and able enthuse and motivate others
- Good planning and organisational skills and able to work to deadlines
- Positive can-do attitude, proactive at prioritising, problem solving and getting things done
- Have access to own transport to reach settings
- Able to use judgement and intellect to work on own initiative
- Friendly and polite with excellent people skills and a sense of humour
- A team player with a willingness to work co-operatively within communities
- Committed to Get Out More's vision and the success of the venture
